## **Election Coming up! Annual Meeting in April!**

The Annual Meeting is coming up in April and the Nominating Committee is already asking for folks to step up and serve - be a nominee for a leadership role here at Prince of Life.

We need to fill 11 positions!

We need four (4) council members. Three of the positions are for three years each. One position is a two-year term due to a resignation. Council members meet the second Tuesday of the month in the evening. Members may attend on Zoom.

Prince of Life has nine committees. Each council member represents one of those committees. When each committee meets their council member attends the meeting and reports back to the council. Only a few committees meet. If you have an interest in the committee you represent and want to "get that committee going" you might be the committee chair. It's not required.

The council secretary position is open. Two years remain on the term. Council meets the second Tuesday. (see above) The secretary also attends the Budget and Annual Meetings. Unlike other council members, the secretary does not represent a committee. The secretary takes council meeting notes, puts the notes

together as minutes, and distributes the minutes to all members of the council via email.

We need three (3) nominees each for Mission Endowment Fund and Nominating Committees. Due to resignations, there are two 2-year terms and one 1-year term on each committee.

The Mission Endowment Fund Committee manages the Endowment fund and decides who receives a share of the proceeds once a year.

The Nominating Committee finds the nominees for the different positions needed to fill the ballot at the Annual Meeting. Also, they should be on hand to count the ballots.

Dear Members of Prince of Life Lutheran Church,

Thank you for your generosity to Camp Lutherwood Oregon in 2023. Your faithful support has helped us achieve so many things in the past year!

We cleaned up our new adjacent property, completely remodeling the main house and giving a much-deserved space to our site manager Tom, his wife Jamie, and dog Houla while still having more rooms to offer to additional staff members and guests.

We built new strategic partnerships with DHS in Lane County, opening channels for more youth in foster care to come to camp. We also worked closely with Pastor Manuel Borbon, allowing us to pilot a new Bilingual Family Camp where 72 people joined us for a weekend of camp conducted in both English and Spanish.

In addition, we began work with CampFire Wilani, opening us up to more outdoor school programming. We have continued to support a quality year-round staffing team and of course provided quality summer programming to youth, adults, and families.

On behalf of all of us at Camp Lutherwood Oregon, thank you again for your generous support in 2023. Together we accomplished many things. We hope to see you at camp in 2024!

## Children, Youth & Family Service Committee

The CYF Service Committee decided at their February 24th meeting to put a partial pause on our regular meetings for a couple of reasons.

The first is that all of our volunteers are needed to help keep worship, Council, and other programs going while the Call Committee works diligently to find another pastor to call. In fact, 4 of our regular committee attendees are either on the Council or the Call Committee or both.

The second is that we had a very helpful meeting with Darcee Kilsdonk during our February meeting. She said the trend in Oregon City publicly funded pre-school, like Head Start, is changing. They have to work harder to find additional eligible children when one of them drops out for any reason. It is possible that they are competing for some of the same children that the statewide Preschool Promise is serving now in Oregon City.

ClackCoKids does an annual assessment of the demographics of the area and they hope to explore the reason for the trend in their 2024 assessment. This does affect whether or not it is a good idea to build another building for Head Start in Oregon City.

However, ClackCoKids is looking into developing their program so that it encompasses childcare as well as pre-school and broadening the base of families (publicly funded, subsidized funding, and fee for

service) who can use the services. Darcee also has connections with other private providers whom she can introduce us to if it turns out that ClackCoKids can't build anything at our site.

We will need to do a feasibility assessment of our property with Tim Richard, the architect referred by ClackCoKids, at some point. It looks like we can safely wait until summer at least to start this. The initial cost is \$1600 and we need to bear that cost. At present we can't determine how much of the remaining cost of \$9280 we would need to pay.

We decided that the Committee will continue to monitor the situation with quarterly, not monthly meetings (next meeting would be in May). We are waiting till we have a new pastor installed and the congregation has made a good adjustment to the change before we take the step of raising \$1600 to start the assessment process.

Don't hesitate to give one of us a call and ask us about what is happening. Those attending the last meeting were Judy Cook, Rebecca Harms, Sue Robinson, Annie Sakaguchi, Bev Spilseth, and Janet Mann. Nick Dierckman, Kay O'Dea, and Julie Schedler also attend regularly.

In 2024, our Healthy Habits program will be adding more opportunities for our community members such as Faith & Finances classes, Affirming Potential classes, and mentorship opportunities!


