I am pleased to be meeting you and walking with you in your mission in this place.

I am honored to be among you as you Proclaim, Serve, and Worship together. I hold you and this congregation in my prayers as you seek to call your next settled pastor. I hope that you will also hold me and the ministry of this congregation in your prayers.



# What Is Redemptive Compassion?

Redemptive Compassion is a biblical perspective on how the church is called to holistically help people in need. Redemptive Compassion challenges many of the traditional ways of addressing need through the following core principles:

- 1. Everyone has <u>VALUE</u> ... therefore,
- 2. We invest RELATIONALLY in others.
- 3. Everyone has <u>CAPACITY</u> and POTENTIAL.
- 4. Mutual PARTICIPATION is required.
- 5. We pray for <u>WISDOM</u> and DISCERNMENT.
- 6. We serve in ways that TRANSFORM.

Our Sunday School 's "Creation Care" curriculum tested this out. We took several soil samples from various places, placed them in glass jars with water, shook them up, and set them on a level place to observe how the particles would settle over time. Our guess is that when we reexamine them, we will be able to determine how fertile our grounds are.

As a teacher, I have discovered just how fertile the minds of our young people really are! What a treasure we have in the youth among us. They are truly the seeds of the future.

# Oregon Synod Lay School of Theology presents the Spring 2024 Course

Dreams and Visions: Accompanying Teens in Our Congregations and Communities

Four Thursday evenings on Zoom, April 4, 11,18, 25, 6:30-8:00 pm

Join us for four weeks on three big questions teens are asking: Who am I? Where do I fit? What difference can I make?

Together, we'll jump into the latest research about young people, share practices and postures to help bridge across generations, and explore ways to support teens, parents, and caregivers amidst a national mental health crisis. Led by Rev. Chris Dela Cruz and Rev. Ron Werner, Jr and the team at Together Lab, who recently launched the statewide Caregiving Toward a Horizon of Wholeness Initiative alongside five ecumenical partners, Trauma-Informed Oregon, and the Lilly Endowment to support teens and caregivers in our congregations and communities on this side of the pandemic.

As always, this course will provide opportunities for relationship-building, critical thinking and spiritual practice.

Course participants and/or their congregations are encouraged to support the course with a financial donation as they are able. A gracious giving range of \$10-\$80 is invited; a \$40 donation covers presenters and administrative costs. April 7th 11:30 am at West Linn Lutheran Church


