## Pastor's Press: Epiphany and a Lifetime of Learning to Trust

The season of Epiphany is a season of light. It celebrates God's self-revelation in Jesus Christ—the light made known to the nations, to the Magi from afar, to John at the Jordan, and to ordinary people who *encountered God's grace* in unexpected ways. Epiphany reminds us that faith begins not with our searching for God, but with God graciously making Himself known.

From a Lutheran perspective, Epiphany also speaks powerfully to the importance of *faith formation* throughout our lives. Faith is not something we "finish" at baptism, confirmation, or any particular milestone. Rather, faith is a *living relationship*, continually formed and re-formed as God's Word and promises meet us in new seasons of life.

The Magi are a fitting image for lifelong faith formation. They do not remain standing at the star's first appearance; they journey, question, worship, and then go home "by another way." Their faith is shaped along the road. In much the same way, God shapes us over time—through study and prayer, through worship

and service, through suffering and joy.

Luther taught that we are *justified by grace through faith*, and that this faith itself is God's gift. Yet even a gift must be nurtured. God uses many means to form us: the hearing of Scripture, the preaching of the gospel, the waters of baptism remembered daily, and the bread and wine that sustain us. These are not only for the young or the new believer; they are for the *whole Church, at every age*.

Epiphany invites us to recognize that God continues to reveal Christ to us in new ways as we grow. A child hears Bible stories and learns to trust God's love. A teenager wrestles with questions and discovers that doubt and faith can exist together. Adults encounter God in vocation, parenting, work, loss, and service. Elders bear witness to a lifetime of God's faithfulness, even as they continue to learn what it means to trust.

## Epiphany House Entrance Chalking

House blessing is an Epiphany tradition used as a way of blessing all who enter, exit, and dwell in your home. You simply write the number of the new year and the letters **C**, **M**, and **B** in chalk on the door or doorframe. The letters stand for the three traditional names of the Magi in Matthew 2: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. The letters can also be a Latin acronym for "*May Christ bless this dwelling.*"

### **Liturgy (for Personal/ Home Use)**

Let us pray. O Lord, Almighty God, bless this house that it may become a shelter of health, chastity, self-conquest, humility, goodness, mildness, obedience to will of God for our lives, and thanksgiving to God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Upon this house and those who dwell herein may Your blessing remain forever, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

(The initials CMB also stand for *Christus mansionem benedicat*: May Christ bless this house.)

The three wise men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar followed the star of God's Son who became man two thousand twenty-six years ago. May Christ bless our dwelling and remain with us throughout the new year. Almighty God, incline your ear. May you bless us and all who are gathered here. Send your holy angel who will defend us and fill with grace all who live here. Amen.

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# Epiphany: A Season of Learning and Recognizing What God Is Doing Now

The season of Epiphany invites the Church to open its eyes. After the quiet wonder of Christmas, Epiphany asks us not only to remember that Christ has come, but to recognize who He is and what God is doing through Him—often in ways we did not expect.

In Lutheran theology, Epiphany is not about human discovery so much as divine revelation. God makes Godself known. The star leads the Magi not because they are especially wise, but because God chooses to be found by outsiders. The heavens open at Jesus' baptism not because Jesus needs affirmation, but because God declares, "This is my beloved Son."

Epiphany reminds us that God is revealed precisely where we might overlook him: in a child, in water and word, in bread and wine, in a crucified and risen Savior. As Martin Luther taught, God often works under the opposite—hidden in humility, weakness, and the everyday. Epiphany trains us to recognize God's presence not in what dazzles the world, but in what God promises.

This season also invites us to recognize that God is always doing something new. Isaiah proclaims, "*Arise, shine; for your light has come.*" The light is not only behind us in Bethlehem; it shines ahead of us into places not yet fully seen. In Christ, God continues to bring new life—new faith, new callings, new possibilities for love and service—often right in the midst of familiar routines.

For Lutherans, this "new thing" is never a departure from the gospel but a fresh expression of it. God does not change, but God's mercy meets us anew in each generation, each congregation, and each life. Through Word and Sacrament, the Holy Spirit continually opens our eyes to see where Christ is at work—in our neighbors, in our communities, and sometimes in ourselves in ways we had not recognized before.

As we journey through Epiphany, we are invited to pray for *eyes that see, ears that hear, and hearts that trust*. May we recognize Christ revealed among us, and may we be surprised by the new things God is bringing to light—even now!

If there is an emergency during Pastor's vacation we have an available local pastor willing to step in. Please contact the office and Sarah will connect you.

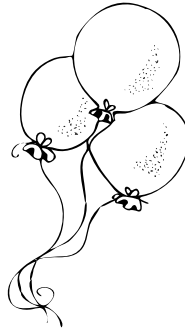
