Please bring your food donations to church and put them in our shopping cart, next to the lift.




Red Cross Blood Drives

- Approve Constitution: February 9th
- Ratify Constitution: April 27th Annual Meeting

Pastoral Continuing Education

On January 27 to 29, Pastor Sharon will be attending a preaching conference in nearby Silverton, OR.

The Byberg Preaching Workshop is dedicated to developing the preaching skills of ELCA pastors in Oregon, Washington and Idaho. The founder, Jonas Byberg, left a bequest to assist ELCA pastors to strengthen the art of the sermon.

Jonas was an inventor and farm machinery manufacturer who was a member of Immanuel Lutheran Church in Silverton, OR. He bequeathed property to the American Lutheran Church to establish the Byberg Homiletic Fund. He directed that income from the fund be used to develop the skills of Lutheran preachers in the Pacific Northwest. The fund has subsidized annual workshops since 1992.


