It is my hope that in this season of Ordinary Time, we here at Prince of Life, make it **extra-ordinary** and wallow a bit in a season of growth for ourselves. Curating a growth mindset and exploring our own mission and life right here in Oregon City.

A **growth mindset** holds a belief in effort, that talents can be developed through hard work, good strategies and input from others. It believes that learning comes from mistakes and failure is seen as a needed opportunity. Development of potential and holding space to be curious are processes that point to growth, while embracing challenges and being open to inevitable change help to move toward new understanding. Many studies have found that in organizations when people are intentional about building a growth mindset

everyone begins to feel empowered and committed to each other and the mission at hand. Input, collaboration and innovation find their way into everything – and for the benefit of the larger group and the on-going mission. And better yet – I would argue that Jesus is a proponent of a growth mindset as well.

Think about it! Jesus is more of a gardener than a carpenter. Good carpenters follow an exact plan filled with specifics to build what has already been decided upon. The quip is, "measure twice, cut once" and the outcome is measured for its accuracy to the intended plan. A gardener on the other hand is focused on supporting growth not outlining what it will be. They make room, tend soil, remove weeds and then let the growth happen. Success is measured differently, and each is given what it needs, not what was best for something else.

Enhancing Our Reach: The Blessings of an Improved Live Streaming System

Dear Beloved Members Prince of Life,

In our increasingly connected world, the ways we gather and share the Good News are constantly evolving. While our cherished sanctuary remains the heart of our worship, the opportunity to extend our reach beyond these walls has become a powerful tool for ministry. That's why we're excited to share some thoughts on the immense benefits of improving our live streaming system, and how it can further bless our congregation and community.

For many years, we have faithfully offered live streams of our services, allowing those who cannot physically be present to participate in worship. However, as technology advances and our needs grow, investing in enhancements to this vital system promises to bring a multitude of blessings:

1. Expanding Our Welcome Mat:

An improved live stream isn't just about clearer pictures and crisper sound; it's about making our welcome mat even wider. For homebound members, those traveling, individuals with health concerns, or even prospective members exploring our church from a distance, a high-quality, reliable live stream means they can truly feel present and connected to our worship, sermons, and sacraments. It ensures no one is left out of our spiritual family life.

2. Nurturing Deeper Engagement:

Imagine being able to clearly hear every word of the sermon, see the expressions of our pastor, readers and musicians, and feel the flow of the liturgy as if you were in the chairs. A professional-grade live

stream can significantly enhance the engagement of our online attendees. Better audio and video quality reduces distractions and allows viewers to fully immerse themselves in the worship experience, fostering a deeper spiritual connection.

3. Empowering Outreach and Evangelism:

In an age where people often seek out information and community online, a robust live stream becomes a powerful evangelism tool. Prospective members can experience our worship style, hear our message of Christ's love, and get a true sense of our congregational spirit before ever stepping foot inside the church. High-quality streams can also be shared more easily on social media, amplifying our reach and spreading the Gospel to new ears and hearts.

4. Archiving and Discipleship Resources:

With a better system, archiving our services becomes more streamlined and the quality of those videos archived significantly improves. This creates a valuable resource for ongoing discipleship – members can revisit sermons, share out on personal social media, catch up on services they missed, and we could better live stream special services like weddings, funerals or congregational meetings. It will continue to be a digital library of spiritual nourishment available whenever needed. Although we have been archiving services on YouTube using our current system, the quality and accessibility will be greatly improved.

5. Supporting Future Ministry:

Investing in our live streaming capabilities is an investment in the future of our ministry.

The HOPE Project

It has been a long time since we built the garden here at Prince of Life. Time has taken its toll on the beds, with many now in disrepair and in need of maintenance. Our plan is to rebuild the beds as time and materials allow us to.

In the past we grew vegetables for the H.O.P.E (Helping Other People Eat) food pantry, with some years growing over 500 pounds of fresh vegetables for the pantry! The folks at the food pantry always appreciate fresh vegetables, as most of their food that is distributed is packaged. We would like to be able to do this again in the future.

World War II ended 80 years ago this year. One contribution to our success was the large number of people growing "Victory Gardens." According to one source I found on the internet, in 1943 42% of the food distributed to our troops came from these Victory Gardens. This food was grown by almost anyone who had some space for planting, and included organizations such as the Girl Scouts, and other service organizations (See the photo from 1943).

At the present we are fighting another battle, although it is a silent one. This battle is food insecurity. As most of you are aware, we gave a large amount of food to the HOPE pantry before Easter (Thank You!) There is and will continue to be an ongoing need for food at the pantry. Revitalizing the garden will allow us to supply the food pantry with fresh vegetables in the future. By the way, we can always use help with the garden.

Presently the garden is being used by three Girl Scout troops using some of the workable beds.



I do not know what or for whom they are growing, but they are certainly very welcome to use them. We are planning on getting the garden going for multiple users, including the food pantry.

In the meantime, I am making plant starts available to anyone interested to take home and grow. They don't have to be for the food pantry, but anything you want to grow and give will be appreciated.

In the end, we can all make a difference in assisting those facing food insecurity, either by growing food, or through donations.

As of writing this article, your Council has approved the purchase of two new cameras and other equipment which will be professionally installed and all users fully trained on the new system.


