Welcome to the Season of Lent

The number 40 has held great significance for God's people, both in the Old and New Testament. Moses fasted on Mount Sinai for 40 days in preparation of receiving God's commandments on behalf of the Hebrew people (Exodus 24:18); the prophet Elijah later walked for 40 days and nights to Mount Horeb (1 Kings 19:8); and of course Jesus fasted and prayed for 40 days in the desert for his public ministry (Mark 1:13). The early church seemed to think it fitting that our communal preparation for Easter also last 40 days. Over the centuries, culture and customary practices adjusted so that the most common Lenten practices include some sort of fast, beginning on a day called Ash Wednesday and lasting until Easter, as well as two other disciplines: almsgiving and prayer.

Ash Wednesday??

On the 46th day before Easter, always a Wednesday (because Easter is always a Sunday), many Christians recognize this start to Lent with ashes either sprinkled on the head or smudged as a cross on the forehead. As the clergy do this they say, "Remember that you are dust, and to just you shall return". Ashes symbolize both our repentant posture toward our sin and the temporal nature of our earthly bodies. We're saying: *This life on earth, fraught with the nature of sin, is not all there is.*

Holy Week??

Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday when we remember Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem with his disciples for the Passover feast. He entered riding on a donkey to a welcoming crowd. Spy Wednesday we remember that Jesus was betrayed by Judas, someone who knew him well and was one of the 12 disciples. The final three days of Holy Week are known as the *triduum* (meaning three days in Latin), starting the evening of Maundy Thursday. This day is a

commemoration of the Last Supper and Jesus washing the feet of his disciples. We then move into Good Friday where we recognize Jesus' sacrifice for all by allowing himself to be crucified. Next is Holy Saturday, which is quiet, with His body in the tomb, we keep silent because it seems as though all is lost. This vigil continues until dusk on Easter Sunday, where we breathe a sigh of relief and rejoice that Christ has been raised from the dead! We are free and He is alive. Truly the best news of all eternity! These are considered the most significant days in the entire Church calendar, the other 362 days point to this pivotal moment.

Lent is Good for Us!

In a world that celebrates indulging our whims whenever we want, practicing the traditions of Lent is countercultural. Welcoming the temporary suffering of Lent is swimming upstream in a culture that prefers to go with the flow. We can choose to live the paradoxical Christian life because we've been given a new life in Christ, which gives us the faith, hope and strength to do so.

You are Invited!

You are personally invited this season to dive deeply into the traditions of fasting, almsgiving and prayer. You are personally invited to practice the ancient Hawaiian spiritual practice of Ho'oponopono - radical reconciliation every Wednesday evening at noon and 5:30 pm. You are personally invited to come and re-charge each Sunday at the Lord's Table and with your beloved community of faith.
